Mask poster, restaurant toolkit helps businesses with COVID guidelines

The Health Department of Northwest Michigan is releasing an updated mask-wearing poster and restaurant toolkit to help businesses and the public keep up to date with the latest COVID-19 guidelines, rules and regulations.

"We hope businesses will download and display [this poster](#) on their entrance door or in other locations to help everyone understand the guidelines of when and where to wear a mask and the guidelines for fully vaccinated and non-vaccinated individuals," said Lisa Peacock, Health Officer. "It can still be confusing on when, where, and why you need to wear a mask and this poster should help," she said.

In addition, the [Food Establishment Toolkit](#) provides guidance for the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services Executive Order currently in effect through July 1, 2021. It assists restaurant owners with everything from indoor gathering limitations to indoor mask requirements, Peacock explained.

Getting vaccinated is the best way to protect yourself, your family, and your community and enjoy the summer, Peacock added.

The health department continues to offer vaccination clinics throughout the four-county jurisdiction, in addition to working with local businesses to offer pop-up vaccination clinics. Public health nurses are on site at these events and able to answer any questions that residents may have regarding the vaccines.
