COVID-19 Case Counts

The Health Department of Northwest Michigan is reporting the following case information:

- On Wednesday, Sept. 8, 33 new cases of COVID-19 were reported in Antrim (8), Charlevoix (13), Emmet (7), and Otsego (5), and one COVID-19 associated death in Otsego County.
- On Thursday, Sept. 9, 45 new cases of COVID-19 in Antrim (9), Charlevoix (13), Emmet (18), and Otsego (5).

As of 4 p.m. Sept. 9, the cumulative case count information for the Health Department of Northwest Michigan is:

- Total COVID-19 cases in the following counties: Antrim (1,824), Charlevoix (1,976), Emmet (2,675), and Otsego (2,599).
- Recovered COVID-19 cases in the following counties: Antrim (1,652), Charlevoix (1,758), Emmet (2,366), and Otsego (2,270).
- Confirmed COVID-19 associated deaths in the following counties: Antrim (33), Charlevoix (27), Emmet (44), and Otsego (43).

On September 8, the State of Michigan reported 964,317 cases and 20,447 deaths.
