## November 18, 2021 Health Department of Northwest Michigan COVID-19 Update

## Health Department jurisdiction reaches 70% of residents 16 and older with first dose

A milestone has been reached locally with 70% of residents 16 years and older in Antrim, Charlevoix, Emmet, and Otsego County with at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine. In nearly two weeks 6.7% of children aged 5-11 have received their first dose of the Pfizer vaccine. The state's objective remains to get as many Michiganders vaccinated as possible, and the Health Department continues to provide opportunities for eligible individuals to receive their first, second, or additional and booster doses.

"Even with 70% vaccination rates in persons 16 and older, there are still many susceptible individuals and a circulating strain (Delta) that is highly contagious and spreads more easily than the original strain. Given the contagiousness of the virus it is unlikely that we will reach a level of immunity that will lead to elimination of this virus in the next few years," said Dr. Meyerson, Medical Director.

Despite reaching this milestone, cases have continued to increase throughout the region. From October 4 – November 7, 2021, the Health Department reported 2,301 total cases of COVID-19 in Antrim, Charlevoix, Emmet, and Otsego County. The majority of the reported cases, hospitalizations, and deaths during this timeframe were unvaccinated. "Being vaccinated reduces your risk of infection but more importantly greatly reduces your risk of severe disease, hospitalization, and death due to this virus. Most reported cases are in unvaccinated individuals, and over 90% of those currently hospitalized in our ICU's are unvaccinated," he added.

Health Department officials reiterate that vaccination is the best way to reduce an individual's risk of contracting COVID-19 as well as the best method of reducing the impact of COVID-19 in our community. Anyone who receives a first dose of the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine through tomorrow, November 19, will be considered fully vaccinated by Christmas Eve.
