What is CHAP?

CHAP helps you work with your medical home to connect you with support you may need to make sure your child is healthy.

We can help:

- Connect you to a medical home
- See you in the privacy of your home
- Link you to community resources
- Assist with counseling services
- Help with transportation needs
- Offer interpretation services

Every child needs a medical home.

It is the best place to take your children for:

- Well child checkups/physicals
- Sick visits
- Accidents
- Immunizations (shots)
- Lead screening
- Emergency room/urgent care follow-up

Transportation

We know it can be hard to arrange. Here are some tips to help:

- Plan ahead. With advance notice, your health plan can help with the costs or arrange to get you to scheduled medical appointments.
- Normally three days' notice is required.
- CHAP can also help arrange transportation for sick visits for your child to get to their medical home.

Remember, your children's doctor knows them best. Use your medical home.

Which Should I Choose?

Medical Home

Stay connected to your doctor. You can call your child's medical home for help or advice.

Call about common illnesses, such as:

- Fever
- Flu
- Sore throat, coughs

Call for problems that may need care now, such as:

- Asthma
- Severe stomach aches
- Cuts that might need stitches
- Vomiting that won't stop
- Infections/severe rashes

And always call for:

- Well child checkups and shots
- Help with long-term illnesses
- To ensure follow-up

Emergency Room

Go to the emergency room when a child could die or risk their health if they do not receive help NOW!

Examples:

- When bleeding won't stop
- When breathing is very hard
- After a serious accident
- After calling POISON CONTROL at 800-222-1222
