## **Immunizations**

- See the Recommended Vaccines for Adults (N-104) Medicaid, Medicare, and some private insurances are accepted.
- Prices vary depending on insurance coverage and vaccines administered. The Health Department also provides reduced rates on certain vaccines for those who qualify.
- If you are unsure if you have had a vaccine, call **1-800-432-4121** or **231-547-0295**, to see if there is one on record.

## **Breast and Cervical Cancer Control Program (BCCCP)**

- Free breast and cervical cancer screening for eligible women aged 40-64 years old.
- Eligibility: Women considered underinsured (High deductibles or Co-Pays) or uninsured and meet age and income guidelines.
- Services provided: clinical breast exam, pap test, pelvic exam, and mammogram. Abnormal screenings are closely followed. If cancer treatment is needed, the Medicaid Treatment Act covers costs.
- The American Cancer Society recommends yearly mammograms beginning at age 40. Early detection of breast cancer by mammography leads to a great range of treatment options, less extensive surgery, and better treatment outcomes.

## **Michigan Colorectal Cancer Early Detection Program (MCRCEDP)**

- Free colorectal cancer screening for eligible men and women 50-64 years of age.
- Eligibility: Men and women who are considered underinsured (High deductibles or Co-Pays) or uninsured and meet age and income guidelines.
- Services Provided: at home fecal occult blood test (FOBT) and/or a colonoscopy at a local hospital (based on client history or positive FOBT).
- The American Cancer Society Recommends beginning at age 50, both men and women should have a colonoscopy every 10 years. The American Cancer Society also states that regular screening (FOBT) can, in many cases, prevent colorectal cancer altogether.

## Dental Health

- Adults with Medicaid or Healthy Michigan Plan can receive full dental services through the Health Department's dental clinics.
- Dental clinic locations: Alpena, Cheboygan, East Jordan, Gaylord, Mancelona, Petoskey, Traverse City, and West Branch.
- The Northern Dental Plan offers dental services at a reduced fee for those who do not have dental insurance and income qualify.

## Affordable Health Insurance Education and Enrollment Assistance

- If you are *not* eligible for Medicare we can help you learn about other health insurance coverage options through the Health Insurance Marketplace or the Healthy Michigan Plan.
- The Healthy Michigan Plan is available to those ages 19-64, depending on their income.
- Healthy Michigan Plan Coverage: doctor and dentist visits, shots, hospital care, glasses, prescriptions, and more.
- There are no age limits or income limits to purchase insurance from the Health Insurance Marketplace.

## Home Care and Hospice

- Home health and hospice services bring health care to people in their own homes as they recover from illness or injury, or health care and comfort at the end of life. For homecare and hospice questions and services please call 800-551-4140.
- There is grant funding available through September to assist with the payment of Medicare part B premiums, help with prescription coverage, and lower medical copays. To find out if you qualify call MMAP (Medicare/Medicaid assistance Program) at 800-803-7174.
